

REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

Israel believed that the temple was built over the navel of the universe, the *axis mundi*, that spot where the world above and the world below met the world of history, thus enabling the three worlds to communicate. When Jesus called himself the new temple, he was claiming to be the centre of the universe, the spot where three-way cosmic communication occurs, the presence of God in the midst of the community. When we accept him in faith, we are accepting these claims. We may profess this belief, but do our lives reflect it?

Although some consider the law a rigid set of precepts, it is really more a collection of directives that have grown out of the experience of life. To say that Jesus is the wisdom of God means that God's wisdom is made known in him and that he is the way that points to God. While laws often embody distinctive cultural values or customs, as wisdom of God, Jesus crosses cultural boundaries and breaks down cultural distinctions. As the wisdom of God, Jesus fulfils the expectations of any and all codes of law.

Both the law and the temple witness to the power of God in the lives of believers. However, both institutions pale in the light of Jesus who is identified as the power of God. This divine power is not revealed in lofty precepts or in magnificent stones, but rather in the broken and pierced body of Jesus Christ. How willing are we to accept him?



<u>DIOCESE OF WOLLONGONG SET TO PRODUCE NET-WORK TEN'S MASS FOR YOU AT HOME</u> The Diocese of Wollongong is set to become the new producer of Mass for You at Home, beaming Mass into people's living rooms across the country each week from Easter Sunday, 2021.

Mass has been broadcast on free-to-air television for decades, providing spiritual nourishment for people who are not able to attend Mass in person for a range of reasons. With COVID-19 restrictions dramatically increasing the number of people in this situation, the need for virtually accessible worship services has never been greater.

Bishop of Wollongong, Most Rev Brian Mascord DD said the diocese was very excited to be entrusted with producing Mass for people who are homebound, without internet, or in prison, aged care facilities and hospitals, as well as those flicking through the channels on a Sunday morning.

****** LATEST DIRECTIVES FROM BISHOP BRIAN

- The total number of people allowed to attend Mass is now replaced by the rules of social dis tancing—2 square metres of space for each per son. Maximum allowed is 200
- First time Mass goers must have their names and contact phone number recorded with the parish, prior to attending, or register on arrival After that please have your named checked off when entering the church, on each occasion, that vou attend.

Those who cannot attend Mass, can continue to nurture their faith through watching Mass on line or other prayerful means.

- + If you are 65years+ and have underlying health concerns or 70+ years please consider staying at home for
- + Mass attendants must prove well and must use sanitizer when entering the Church.
- + When leaving please leave your kneeler down, so those areas can be cleaned.
- + Offering (Sunday Mass only) is to be placed in boxes provided (mounted on wall) at the entrances, as you enter the Church or after Mass, or ideally given through direct debit.

Collection plates will no longer be passed around to avoid spread of germs/viruses.

- + No longer holy water in the bowl at the entrance
- + Please do not touch any statutes/paintings/icons
- + Not to shake hand at any event.
- + Holy Communion given into the hand only
