FIRST READING: Deuteronomy 4:1-2. 6-8

You may add nothing to the word which I speak to you – keep the commands of the Lord.

Moses said to the people: 'Now, Israel, take notice of the laws and customs that I teach you today, and observe them, that you may have life and may enter and take possession of the land that the Lord the God of your fathers is giving you. You must add nothing to what I command you, and take nothing from it, but keep the commandments of the Lord your God just as I lay them down for you. Keep them, observe them, and they will demonstrate to the peoples your wisdom and understanding. When they come to know of all these laws they will exclaim, "No other people is as wise and prudent as this great nation." And indeed, what great nation is there that has its gods so near as the Lord our God is to us whenever we call to him? And what great nation is there that has laws and customs to match this whole Law that I put before you today?'

GOSPEL: Mark 7:1-8. 14-15. 21-23

You forget the commandments of God and hold on to human tradition.

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lip-service,

while their hearts are far from me.

The worship they offer me is worthless,

the doctrines they teach are only human regulations. You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.'

He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and make a man unclean.'

HOMILY: SUNDAY 22, B.

A spiritual Guru asked his students, 'what is the thing that a person should always avoid at any cost!' They answered, 'an evil eye, an unfaithful friend and a crooked heart!' He then asked them, 'and what is the thing that a person should always strive for at any cost?' They answered, 'a pure eye, a faithful friend and a pure heart!'

The Gospel today speaks of what we need to have when we come before the Lord to make prayer heard or an offering acceptable!

Referring to the Jewish traditional practices before and after eating meals, things that we do in our modern days too: washing and cleanings hands, cups, and vessels before and after eating, Jesus said that we must do the same for our heart and soul before we come before the Lord to make our prayers or offerings.

A prayer made from a clean heart and a clean soul is acceptable to God. Jesus blesses those with clean hearts, the kingdom of God belongs to them!

In opposition to a clean heart is an unclean heart made unclean and dirty by inner, corrupt thoughts; by evil, greedy, and selfish desires ... things that come from within a person. Jesus names some of those in the Gospel.

Jesus also speaks of what kind of worship true worship and acceptable to God!

Jesus rejects the kind of worship made by the Pharisees. They worship God, not with their lives with their clean hearts, but only with their words calculated. Jesus calls it 'a lips-service, or a fake worship.'

Jesus points out to them that their lives in the Temple are different from their lives outside the Temple, or outside the worship hours! In other words, they lead a double life, for their lives while in the Temple do not reflect the same lives outside the Temple.

A true, genuine worship must flow from a person's life, and not only from the mouth of the person. A word-service is a lips-service. Where are you standing in this?

PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL

Leader: Let us pray to God our heavenly Father that our faith may Be sincere and be a matter of the heart, for that is the only worship that truly honours Him.

For all the sick, the homebound, and elderly, of the parish, that through the love and care of others, they may find health and self-worth. **Lord, hear us.**
