SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY STATEMENT - SUNDAY 30 AUGUST: TO LIVE LIFE TO THE FULL: MENTAL HEALTH IN AUSTRALIA TODAY

The COVID-19 pandemic is impacting the mental health of many members of our parishes, schools, and communities. In fact, most of us will experience a mental health problem at some point over the course of our lives. Understanding mental health will help us to be aware of those who need our support. Our parishes, organisations and communities can be places of acceptance care and healing, not places of rejection, judgment, or stigma. The Bishops invite us all to reject stigmatisation, to work for the transsion that meets the needs of the poorest and most marginalised members of our community. The statement is aimed at inspiring reflection and action for the following 12 months, is now available as a free download at the Social Justice Website - www.socialjustice.catholic.org.au Launching the Social Justice Statement, Bishop Terry Brady said that "our society tends to push away or draw away from those who confront us with our frailties and limitations" but "this is not the way of Jesus". He encourages us to follow Jesus by "drawing near to those who are experiencing mental ill health" and acknowledging that "they are members of the Body of Christ - 'they' are part of 'us'!"

LATEST DIRECTIVES FROM BISHOP BRIAN

- 1) The total number of people allowed to attend Mass is now replaced by the rules of social dis tancing—4 square metres of space for each per son. Maximum allowed is 100
- 2) First time Mass goers must have their names and contact phone number recorded with the parish, prior to attending.

 After that please have your named checked off when entering the church, on each occasion, that you attend.

You are not required to pre register for weekday Mass.

Those who cannot attend Mass, can continue to nurture tion, but mainly to let us know how we can support their faith through watching Mass on line or other you. prayerful means.

- + If you are 65years+ and have underlying health concerns or 70+ years please consider staying at home for your safety
- + Mass attendants must prove well and must use sanitizer when entering the Church.
- + When leaving please leave your kneeler down, so those areas can be cleaned.
- + Offering (Sunday Mass only) is to be placed in boxes provided (mounted on wall) at the entrances, as you enter the Church or after Mass, or ideally given through direct debit.

Collection plates will no longer be passed around to avoid spread of germs/viruses.

- + No longer holy water in the bowl at the entrance door.
- + Please do not touch any statutes/paintings/icons
- + Not to shake hand at any event.
- + Holy Communion given into the hand only and in one line.
- 3) Reconciliation/Confession: by appointment with Fr. Peter (his phone: 0406001540.)
- 4) Baptism: by appointment either on Saturday or Sunday
- 5) You are encouraged to install the COVID-19 App onto your mobile phone.
